Unused or Expired Medications



Did you know...

Unused or expired prescription medications kept at home or thrown in the trash are a public safety issue, leading to accidental poisoning, overdose, and abuse. Medications thrown in the trash can be stolen and abused or illegally sold. Medications that are flushed can contaminate our water supply.

For proper disposal options...



Ask the pharmacist for a Medication Envelope

for disposing all prescription medications, including controlled substances:

- Place all unused medications (in their original containers) in the Medication Envelope
- Liquids must be placed in a sealed plastic bag before placing in the Medication Envelope
- Seal and Mail the envelope (it's prepaid, no stamp required) through the U.S. Post Office or mailbox

Drop off prescription medications

including controlled substances
