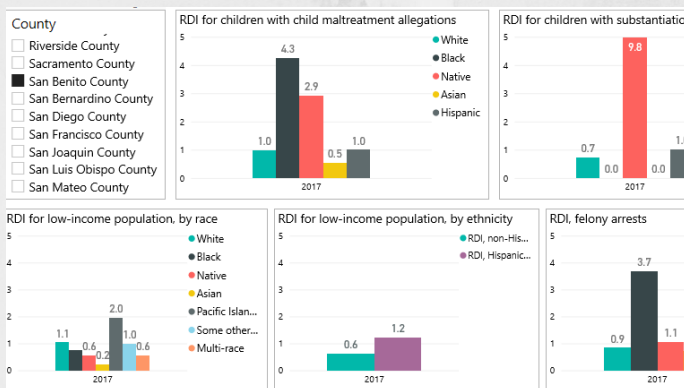
Free training is available for mandated child abuse reporters, so they may carry out their responsibilities properly and understand their critical role in the lives of children and families. The OCAPs Mandated Reporter Training has been launched with updated content and a fresh new look! Along with a general training for all mandated reporters, the website now includes updated training for child care providers, medical professionals, law enforcement, mental health professionals, social workers, clergy and volunteers. In the coming year, the general training, child care provider training, and school personnel training will be available in Spanish.

Educational Rights for HOMELESS YOUTH

Homeless children and youth are those who lack a fixed, regular and adequate nighttime residence.

- **5 children die every day from child abuse and neglect.**
- **A report of child abuse is made every ten seconds.**
- **Nearly 700,000 children are abused in the U.S annually.**

Children and youth experiencing homelessness and children and youth in foster care must receive the full protections and services provided under all federal and state laws, as related to homeless and foster education.
