

## San Benito County Public Health Services COVID-19 UPDATE: FEBRUARY 5, 2021 Epidemiologic Week 5: 1/31/2021 - 2/6/2021




This report is based on only available data; not all results have been received.

San Benito County (SBC) Public Health Services continues to work with medical providers to identify and test individuals who meet criteria for COVID-19 testing. As of February 5, 2021, thirteen new cases have been reported, for a total of 5,418 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in SBC. Confirmed cases include patients who have since recovered and those who are deceased. Fifty-three percent (2,869) of positive cases reported were female; ages ranged from 15 days to 101 years (median: 35 years).






