

San Benito County Public Health Services COVID-19 UPDATE: MARCH 16, 2021 Epidemiologic Week 11: 3/14/2021 - 3/20/2021



This report is based on only available data; not all results have been received.

San Benito County (SBC) Public Health Services continues to work with medical providers to identify and test individuals who meet criteria for COVID-19 testing. As of March 16, 2021, six new cases have been reported, for a total of 5,794 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in SBC. Confirmed cases include patients who have since recovered and those who are deceased. Fifty-three percent (3,068) of positive cases reported were female; ages ranged from 15 days to 101 years (median: 35 years).





Confirmed COVID-19 Cases by Test Date in SBC




Date of Test


