



San Benito County Public Health Services continues to work with medical providers to identify and test individuals who meet criteria for COVID-19 testing. There have been 224 new cases reported since November 30 for a total of 16,935 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in SBC. Confirmed cases include patients who have since recovered and those who are deceased. Fifty-three percent (9,040 of positive cases reported) were female; ages ranged from 1 day to 101 years (median: 46 years). All results included in this update are current to December 7, 2022 at 4:00PM.
