


# **COVID-19 Snapshot**

San Benito County Public Health Services continues to work with medical providers to identify and test individuals who meet criteria for COVID-19 testing. There have been 22 new cases reported since April 5 for a total of 17,880 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in SBC. Confirmed cases include patients who have since recovered and those who are deceased. Fifty-three percent (9,596 of positive cases reported) were female; ages ranged from 1 day to 101 years (median: 37 years). All results included in this update are current to April 12, 2023 at 2:00PM.


